A NEW art exhibition inspired by the home of a Victorian master painter has begun in Cambridge.

Valour comprises a number of paintings inspired by David Parr House in Gwydir Street, and put on to canvas by Regine Bartsch, artist-in-residence at St Peter's Church on Castle Hill.

Regine's work focuses on the interiors of the Victorian painter's home.
